Fr. Charles Connor tours a replica of one of the historic ships, the "Dove" and explores the site of St. Mary's City.

Wednesday July 6

ST. INIGOES

Fr. Charles Connor recounts founding of St. Inigoes in Maryland in 1637, and its rich Jesuit heritage.
